

Setup Apple Pay

Apple ™ will no longer show the Apple Pay on your Stripe account without the following certificate setup in Stripe, with matching Domain URL.

Note: There are three major steps. The Mition team needs to create the Stripe Certificate itself and add a dedicated MerchantID in the Mition Apple Developer setup. This is needed for Web and for iOS Apps. You will need a Mition sales representative to help with that part, so setup a 15 minute Teams meeting with the technical team to do it support@mition.com




Setting up Apple Pay in Stripe

Go to Stripe and setup (note: do this in Test Mode if your Mition portal is using the Stripe Test Keys and not yet live).






Then navigate to Payment Methods and select the Default Configuration




Find Apple and then view configure domains






Add the domain that matches your Mition URL (if not yet live use the test url for now)





Go back to the Apple Payment Setting and now click on Configure iOS Certificates (follow steps above if you cant remember where that is)






Next add a new application under iOS certificates





Click continue and save the file somewhere for now, email that to your Mition representative.





Here is where the Mition Team will take that certificate file and add it to your APP in the Apple Store.

Mition Representative Steps

Accept any terms / conditions

For the Identifier, use the customers mition url, which should match the iOS app url with "merchant." Infront of it.

Identifier: merchant.dev.mition.com.au

Name: Use the customers name or abbreviations e.g. Dev Merchant ID for Apple Pay

Download your certificate to your Mac, then double click the .cer file to install in Keychain Access. Make sure to save a backup copy of your private and public keys somewhere secure.

Download the certificate, send back to customer to complete their Stripe certificate for Apple Pay.

The key way to test this is in Safari on mobile or desktop, the Apple Pay option shows up in My details > Payment Settings (you don't have to setup an invoice to pay). As long as Apple Pay shows up, its good to go.
